THE PLACE

Koolaree is a beautiful site of 137 acres on the arm of Kootenay Lake.

TRANSPORTATION

Koolaree is a flagstop on the C.P.R. eight miles East of Nelson. If motoring, please advise the registrar of the time you expect to arrive at MacDonald's Landing on the North side of the Lake, so that arrangements may be made for launch service.

WHAT YOU WILL FIND

A rustic, log lodge with a stone fireplace. A splendid dining room overlooking the Lake. Kitchen with running water. Floored sleeping cabins. A beautiful outdoor chapel. Grounds for volley ball, badminton and softball. Swimming—plenty of food and no mosquitoes. The Lake is only a stone's throw from the tents (perfect for a morning dip).

WHAT TO BRING

General—Your ration book with usable coupons. Bible, notebook, towels, soap, mirror, comb, heavy sweater or coat, heavy shoes, running shoes, two pairs heavy blankets, sheets, empty tick (2 ft. 6 in. x 6 ft.), small cushion or pillow, bathing suit, flashlight. If desired, a camera, musical instruments and badminton racquet.

Additional for Boys—Jack-knife, suitable clothes for Sunday chapel.

Additional for Girls—Camp costume is shorts, bloomers, knickers or dark skirt. At least one white middie with navy blue collar and black tie for Sunday. Non-swimmers are requested to wear RED Bathing Caps.

BOYS' CAMP

COST

For Boys' and Girls' Camps—\$9.00 plus your own transportation fare.

Registration must be in at least ten days before each camp.

Leadership

In addition to a qualified director, the staff of the camps will include a nurse, one experienced in first aid and life saving, sports' director, and experienced group leaders.

In view of transportation difficulties there will be no visiting day this year.

Since the meals for Boys' and Girls' camps are adequate, it is requested that no "boxes" be sent from home.
